



Total Cases (civil servant/contractor) [] = Number of new occurrences

OSHA Recordable Cases = Fatalities, Lost Time, Incidents, and Restricted Work Incidents.
Incidents = Cases in which more than first aid treatment is required, but less than 8 hours of time is lost.
Restricted Work Incidents = Cases requiring first aid treatment, resulting in light duty restrictions.

Injury/Mishap Information

- The Center has been **17** days **without** a Civil Servant or Contractor **Lost Time Injury. (Record 75 days).**
- Lost Time Accident** - On September 16, 2004, a Lockheed Martin Government Services employee sustained a left knee strain while stepping off of an elevator, resulting in 1 lost workday. The employee slipped due to spilled coffee that had not been cleaned up.
- First Aid Case** - An Impact Management employee sustained an eye irritation while removing a dust mask and accidentally letting the mask slip, striking the right eye.



Safety Topic of the Month - Fire Safety - The National Fire Protection Association estimates that approximately 80% of fire deaths in the U.S. and Canada occur in the home (approx. 11 people per day).
