

OSHA Recordable Cases = Fatalities, Lost Time, Incidents, and Restricted Work Incidents.
Incidents = Cases in which more than first aid treatment is required, but less than 8 hours of time is lost.
Restricted Work Incidents = Cases requiring first aid treatment, resulting in light duty restrictions.

- The Center has been **31** days **without** a Civil Servant or Contractor **Lost Time Injury. (Record 433 days)**
- No injuries or illness involving civil servants or contractors were reported.



Wiring Warnings - Faulty wiring and other electrical problems cause many fires each year, some of them resulting in death or injury. Some signs of potential electrical problems are flickering lights; hot electrical outlets; the smell of electrical insulation burning; repeated tripping of a circuit breaker; loose connections; defective, damaged or worn plugs, extension cords and lights; and extension cords running under carpets and rugs, where they can overheat and cause a fire. If any of these problems occur within your home or workplace, take the necessary corrective action.
