


LaRC SAFETY HIGHLIGHTS

[] = Number of new occurrences

OSHA Recordable Cases = Fatalities, Lost Time, Incidents, and Restricted Work Incidents.
Incidents = Cases in which more than first aid treatment is required, but less than 8 hours of time is lost.
Restricted Work Incidents = Cases requiring first aid treatment, resulting in light duty restrictions.

Injury/Mishap Information

- The Center has been **32** days **without** a Civil Servant or Contractor **Lost Time Injury. (Record 433 days)**
- Restricted Workday Incident** - A SEC employee sustained multiple contusions and abrasions while moving a monitor from a control room to a storage area in another facility. The employee stepped in a 2-foot deep trench and fell. The trench had been left opened by maintenance personnel, after completing facility maintenance. (14 restricted workdays incurred)
- OSHA Recordable Incident** - An AAAC employee sustained a chest strain while using a torque wrench to assemble plumbing for a facility nozzle. (Prescription medication administered)



Crosswalk Safety - Pedestrians, don't be like Jonathan Jay whose epitaph read, "Here lies the body of Jonathan Jay who died protecting his right-of-way. He was right as he walked along, but he was just as dead as if he'd been dead wrong."

Drivers - During the summer months, there are many people on Center who are not familiar with LaRC. Please be courteous to pedestrians and stop to allow them to safely cross in crosswalks. **Pedestrians** - It is your responsibility to ensure that traffic is stopped before entering a crosswalk. Do not assume that a vehicle will stop. In a battle between a vehicle and a pedestrian, the vehicle will win every time.
