


LaRC SAFETY HIGHLIGHTS

OSHA Recordable Cases = Fatalities, Lost Time, Incidents, and Restricted Work Incidents.
Incidents = Cases in which more than first aid treatment is required, but less than 8 hours of time is lost.
Restricted Work Incidents = Cases requiring first aid treatment, resulting in light duty restrictions.

Injury/Mishap Information

- The Center has been **42** days **without** a Civil Servant or Contractor **Lost Time Injury. (Record 42 days)**
- **First Aid Cases**
 - A SAIC employee strained his shoulder while catching himself during a slip off of a loading dock. The employee was counseled to return the loading dock-to-vehicle transition plate to its relaxed position in the future by pulling it down while standing on the ground instead of pushing it down while standing on the loading dock.



Safety Topic of the Month - Electrical Hazards - Electrical shock is a common hazard in the office workplace because of the great number of electrical and electronic devices. Don't try to repair electrical equipment unless you are properly trained; keep electricity and moisture apart; and don't handle electrical equipment with damp hands. Report any incident of electric shock, no matter how mild and remove the item from service immediately.
